10 THINGS TO DO AND SEE **FOR FREE**

Admission to a theme park can be expensive. So, too, are visits to many of Florida's top attractions. The good news is that Southwest Florida offers plenty of activities and events that don't cost a thing while immersing you in local color.

■ Musical interludes

From Fisherman's Village in Punta

Gorda to Mercato in Naples and Stan's Idle Hour on Marco Island, shopping centers, restaurants and bars throughout the area offer free concerts and live entertainment performed alfresco practically every day of the week.

We're especially fond of the intimate venues of Cheers at Waterside Shops in Naples and The Center Bar at the Promenade in Bonita Springs, where it seems everybody knows your name.

Babcock Ranch in Charlotte County also serves up a hometown version of "American Bandstand" with Friday evening performances by Southwest Florida favorites. Babcock Bandstand concerts begin at 6 p.m. under the downtown bandshell. Food trucks line the road, and Slater's Goods & Provisions serves beer and cocktails at a patio bar.

■ Festival freebies

Southwest Florida loves a good festival and celebrates just about anything - music, movies, nature, art and otherwise — without a cover charge. Sure, the area hosts well-known and well-attended events like national art shows (see Arts for All), but it's things like the Everglades City Seafood Festival (Feb. 17-19) and LaBelle's annual Swamp Cabbage Festival that truly provide local flavor. This season's would have been the 86th annual Sanibel Shell Festival and the 64th annual Fort Myers Beach Shrimp Festival. We look forward to their return when their communities recover from Hurricane Ian.

Where else but LaBelle could pull off a celebration of the sabal palm and an ode to agriculture? The city's 57th annual

For the granddaddy of all free festivals, head to Immokalee Jan. 21-22. That's when the Seminole Casino Hotel, with Florida Weekly as the headline sponsor, presents the second annual Rockabillique, with 20 musical acts, classic car and vintage bike shows, and mustache, pinup and tattoo contests honoring all things mid-century Americana.

■ To market, to market

Florida is one of the nation's top states for agriculture, which you'll discover while browsing the kaleidoscopic colors of just-harvested fruits and veggies at a local farmers market. From the Atlanta Braves market at CoolToday Park (the



Spring Training home of the World Series champions in Wellen Park) to the organic garden at Shangri-La Springs in Bonita and the cobblestoned sidewalks of Third Street South in Naples, Southwest Florida

offers a bounty of seasonal and yearround markets that are a veritable feast for the senses.

Equal parts shopping and social event, many markets also host live entertainment. The events attract homespun vendors selling kitschy crafts, handmade soaps, jewelry and more, so visiting is always a treasure hunt. New to the farmers market mix this year: Market Thyme every Saturday morning at the Calusa Nature Center & Planetarium off Ortiz Boulevard in Fort Myers.

■ Rum-pum-pum-pum

Mystical and borderline exotic, there's something about a drum circle that sings to the spirit, the soul, spontaneity and self-expression. Perhaps it's the freedom to play — or dance — to your own beat or the shared connection to community

and culture over a methodical almost monotonal primal pulse. Hand drummers, hula hoopers and spectators are always welcome to experience these magical moments offered by the Southwest Florida Community Drum Circle biweekly at Cambier Park in Naples and the Fort Myers Drum Circle in downtown locales, including Centennial Park and the patio of the Fort Myers Regional Library.

Drum circles are even better when accompanied by water and setting sun. The Englewood Drum Circle meets every Sunday on Englewood Beach an hour before sunset.

Check Facebook for regularly scheduled events as well as pop-up locations.

Get on your bike and ride

See the sights on a bike with dozens of new friends. Southwest Florida Critical Mass, a cycling club for all ages, takes to the streets for monthly rides throughout the region. With more than 3,400 followers on Facebook, some outings are akin

to a Tour de France field - minus the mountains.

For those who prefer solo excursions or bicycle rides for two, Team Punta Gorda offers a fleet of 36 bright yellow bikes, including three trikes and a hand-pedaled cycle, all perfect for exploring the city's quiet streets and historic homes, downtown restaurants and boutiques, waterfront parks and Fisherman's Village. The free loaners are available at Laishley Marina, Four Points Sheraton, the Bayfront Wellness Center and Springhill Suites. Simply check in with the host site, and provide ID and a credit card as a deposit (no charge when bike is returned). Helmet, lock, cable and map are provided.

A day with the dog

Sometimes, a dog just needs to run with the pack. Dog parks throughout Southwest Florida give Fido freedom to roam. Charlotte County offers Katherine Ariens Dog Park in Charlotte Harbor and Ann & Chuck Dever Regional Paw Park in Englewood. You'll find dog parks in Lee County at Buckingham Park, the Estero Park and Recreation Center, Judd Park in North Fort Myers, Veterans Park in Lehigh Acres, Bonita Springs Dog Park, and Wa-Ke Hatchee Park off Bass Road in Fort Myers. Collier County offers Rover Run at Veterans Community Park, Naples



Dog Beach next to Lovers Key State Park in Bonita Springs is Southwest Florida's only Gulf of Mexico beach where dogs can run free, frolic in the sand and splash in the surf. Parking is free. Cue the wet-dog smell on the car ride home. The state park was closed in the weeks after Hurricane Ian, so be sure to check the status before venturing out with Fido in tow.

Many shopping centers have also gone to the dogs, offering dog-friendly destinations and outdoor dining.

■ The power of observation

Brush up on the latest fashion trends

without spending a dime. Fifth Avenue South and Third Street South — Naples' premier shopping districts — offer prime people-watching and window-shopping destinations beloved by the 1%. Covet-worthy couture is always on display, worn by passersby and shown in shops. Be sure to study the streetscape and parking areas, where Lamborghinis, Ferraris, Bentleys, Aston Martins and other exotic cars are more prolific than any domestic make or model.

Down on the farm

You don't have to put a lot of miles on the car or even venture east of the interstate to visit an honest-to-goodness working farm. Surrounded by upscale communities on Penzance Boulevard in

Fort Myers, Southern Fresh Farms carries on a nearly 50-year family tradition, growing hydroponic produce and flowers and tending to rescued barnyard animals, including cows, goats, a mini donkey,



chickens and a turkey. Its park-like setting offers a large playground, a swing facing a waterfall and even a microbrewery. Raw honey, produce and cut flowers are available seasonally.

Visitors to 31 Produce in Alva can roam the 80-acre farm, check out the butterfly garden and catfish pond, pan for precious stones and fossils, and pet a menagerie of miniature donkeys, Nigerian dwarf goats, as well as a pot belly pig, rabbits and guinea pigs. The petting zoo also has not-so-cuddly chickens and an African spur tortoise. While there, dine at the Cracker Shack Cafe, which specializes in farm-to-table dishes and country cooking, and consider reaping your own harvest. 31 Produce offers a cornucopia of seasonally available you-pick options at a fraction of grocery store prices, including beefsteak tomatoes, greens, squash, herbs, melons, strawberries and dragon fruit.

Farmer Mike's U-Pick in Bonita Springs is also a great adventure that shows the kids where their food comes from.

Art for all

Southwest Florida is home to many community art centers and galleries of national renown, and most offer free admission to view original works by local and international artists. True to its namesake, the Bob Rauschenberg Gallery on the campus of Florida South-Western State College in Fort Myers celebrates contemporary art with exhibits by major artists (no admission; however, donations are accepted). Florida Gulf Coast University offers three galleries and free artists' talks. The Visual Arts Center in downtown Punta Gorda features new exhibits every month. Shows by members, faculty and local student artists, plus national and international traveling exhibitions at the Centers for the Arts Bonita Springs are always free.


Explore working studios and watch demos from local arts during Art Alive! the first Wednesday, first Thursday and third Saturday of each month through April in the Naples Art District, tucked away in plain sight along Shirley Street between J&C Boulevard and Pine Ridge Road. And don't miss the Marco Island Center for the Arts and the Arts Center Theatre.

Some of the country's top-rated juried art shows happen right here, including the No. 2 Bonita Springs National Art Festivals (Jan. 14-15, Feb. 11-12 and March 4-5). ArtFest Fort Myers returns to downtown Feb. 4-5.

■ Pier one

Among the area's most beloved landmarks to be ravaged by Hurricane Ian are the iconic piers in Naples and on Fort Myers Beach, which for decades offered prime venues for peoplewatching, fishing and picturesque sunsets over the Gulf of Mexico.

The closest spot for similar experiences for the foreseeable future is the El Jobean Fishing Pier (en route from Port Charlotte to Englewood), which provides opportunities to snag snappers, speckled trout and snook and to marvel at a sunset over the Myakka River.

THINK - AND SHOP - OUT OF THE BOX WHEN INTRIGUING FLAVORS ARE WHAT YOU CRAVE

If you're in a rut when it's time to cook dinner, the problem might be what you are bringing home.

There's no doubt that supermarkets and big-box stores offer one-stop convenience and lots of choices — although with the recent supply-chain problems that's not a given anymore - but if you want to give your culinary mojo a kick-start, consider exploring the many farmers markets, local shops and ethnic

stores that abound in the region. And then spend some time hunting and gathering — you know, the way people used to shop before the big boys cropped up on every corner.

Obviously, you won't buy your cleaning supplies, paper products and toothpaste at these establishments, but you are likely to find fresh, locally grown produce and meat, scratch-made baked and canned goods as well as exotic ingredients from abroad that will add depth and adventure to your repertoire and plate.

Like what, you ask?

How about ground elk burgers for dinner? Homemade mozzarella, locally grown tomatoes and basil plus intensely flavored (and lab tested for quality) extra virgin olive oil and balsamic vinegar for a spectacular caprese salad? Sticky rice with mangoes for dessert?

These and many other interesting dishes are possible if you take the time to gather the proper ingredients from specialty stores that offer them.

So let's start with that ground elk. Carnivores will delight in the abun-

dance of choices to be found inside the small storefront known as Jimmy P's Butcher Shop & Deli. Situated on U.S. 41 in Naples and on Bernwood Drive in Bonita Springs, this family owned and operated butcher shop sells an impressive variety of high-quality meat, including wagyu beef, heritage Berkshire pork, rabbit and the aforementioned ground elk. During one excursion to the Naples store, I spied packages of ground camel as well.

Jimmy P's makes its own smoked andouille, bratwurst, blood sausage, lamb merguez and pork bangers. They smoke their hams and make wagyu corned beef brisket. In search of lamb or chicken demi-glace? Yep, they've got that, too, along with black winter truffle butter.

While Circle C Farm in Bonita Springs might not have quite the range of meats that Jimmy P's does, it makes up for that with its humane approach to raising the meat it sells. It features grass-fed and grass-finished beef, pastured pork, along with bones, broth and soup made from the same sources. If you are looking for eggs and meat from humanely pasture-raised chickens, they do that, too.

They also sell fresh Gulf of Mexico

seafood, including spiny lobster and stone crabs, and some exceptional unfiltered avocado honev.

This is the source for exacting chefs like Harold Balink, who owns Harold's in Fort Myers, and Vincenzo Betulia. who serves Circle C's chicken and eggs in his French Brasserie Rustique, Osteria Tulia, and Bar Tulia in Naples. Melissa Akin, executive chef at Cielo on Sanibel, is also a regular here.

Ms. Akin, whose island restaurant was not open in the weeks following Hurricane Ian, has some other favorites, too. "I would have to say any of the local fresh markets would be my choice for fresh ingredients," she says. "Farmer Mike's is a great one for local produce

and fresh flowers. I also love Leaf Asian Market."

Farmer Mike's in Bonita Springs is one of those places you should check out if you haven't. Almost every chef I talk to loves it, and for good reason. The vegetables are raised there, meaning they are fresh. You can pick some yourself or choose from those that are already harvested. And if you've never picked your own flowers, try it out at their pick-it-yourself garden, providing the finishing touch for a meal at home.

For something a touch fancier, check out DeRomo's Gourmet Market & Restaurant at the Promenade in Bonita Springs. Stock up on all sorts of things that you can cook — or use in place of cooking: fresh-baked bread; cheese, including fresh mozzarella made in the store; specialty grocery items such as truffle oils, pastas, marinades, seasonings; and an array of produce, meat and seafood.

Gloria Jordan, the peripatetic chef/ owner of La Trattoria Cafe Napoli in Fort Myers, enjoys wandering the region for great ingredients for cooking in her home and her restaurant. Among her favorite spots: Lawhon's Grocery & Meat, an old-fashioned butcher, deli and grocery store in North Fort Myers.

"I love shopping for quality American meat in this store," she says. "You can



awesome products, including vegetables typical of India. You can also find fresh foods made by mom and pop."

Punta Gorda home cook Lou Brancaccio is very picky about the ingredients he uses. The retired newspaper editor embraces his Italian heritage particularly in the kitchen, where he makes his own pizza, pasta, cioppino, lasagna — well, you get the idea.

samic vinegar and extra virgin olive oil, Mr. Brancaccio strolls down to nearby Fishermen's Village and into Bella Balsamic & the Pressed Olive. Unlike the balsamics and olive oils you find on most grocery store shelves, these are fresh and intensely flavored. The olive oils are extra virgin cold-pressed and are sent to a third-party lab for analysis to ensure their quality. Yes, they cost a bit more than the supermarket varieties, but Mr. Brancaccio offers this philosophy: "Not unlike special-occasion restaurants we might go to with a spouse or good friend, special-occasion olive oil is a thing for some of us. Bella Balsamic provides this.

"Think of the various notes one might find in a good wine and consider the same opportunity in olive oil. And remember: When cooking with olive oil and you're ready to plate, splash some of the good, fresh stuff on, right at the end."



Bonita Springs moved toward foodtruck friendly in 2020 when it changed a city ordinance limiting the number of trucks allowed around town. Alva

This rural, unincorporated swath of Lee County east of Fort Myers is a place of citrus groves, cattle, oak trees and woodland trails ideal for horseback riding.

An assumption many newcomers make is that the town must be named for Thomas Alva Edison, the inventor who owned a winter home in Fort Myers. Not so. Sea captain Peter Nelson chose the name for the small white flowers, called alvas, that he found here in the late 19th century.

Residents have been successful at preserving Alva's charms. No big condos, overpasses or shopping malls here. Alva was beautiful when Capt. Nelson first ventured up the river, and it remains much the same today.

Ave Maria

One of Southwest Florida's fastest growing areas is the town of Ave Maria. About a half-hour drive east of Naples, it was founded in 2007 by Barron Collier Cos., the founding family of Collier County, and Tom Monaghan, the founder of Domino's

Today's Ave Maria is home to thousands of residents and growing commercial businesses as well as private schools, including Ave Maria University. The focal point of the town center is the Ave Maria Oratory.

Babcock Ranch

Babcock Ranch is a solar-powered city destinted to have some 50,000 residents at buildout. It's also a regional outdoor adventure destination, with walking/cycling trails and lakes stocked with bass, all among a mosaic of oak hammocks and dry prairie, palmetto flatwoods and cypress domes.

Start discovering Babcock at Woodlea Hall in the town's Founder's Square. The civic and information hub of Babcock, it is perhaps the most important initial destination for first-time visitors, whether here to enjoy a day on the lake or to learn more about Babcock Neighborhood School (grades K-5) and Babcock High School (grades 6-11, with grade 12 coming in the next academic year).

Boca Grande

Called "the preppiest place on Earth"

by The Wall Street Journal, this tony resort community on Gasparilla Island is an outpost of charm, grace and wealth. The town centerpiece is the grand and gracious Gasparilla Inn, circa 1911 and with three croquet lawns. It's not all about lawn bowling and the beach here, though. The village has a picturesque bicycle path and is home to the World's Richest Tarpon Tournament.

■ Bonita Springs

This golf mecca in southern Lee County is much more than tee boxes and greens. Indeed, there are numerous golf courses throughout the city's 39 or so square miles, but there's a whole lot more here, too.

The Centers for the Arts Bonita Springs is home for film festivals, art shows, performances and classes of all kinds for all ages. There's also Riverside Park, complete with a bandshell.

Everglades Wonder Gardens, a charming throwback to the days of Florida roadside attractions, has been right there along Old 41 Road since 1936. There's also Shangri-La Springs, a stately property that



opened in 1921 and has been revitalized in recent years to offer an organic garden and restaurant, fitness studio and spa, a gift shop and an event/wedding venue.

Longtime residents know their city has come a long way in a short period of time. In 1970, the population was just a bit shy of 2,000; today, it's more than 57,000.

Cape Coral

Back in the late 1950s, two visionary Baltimore businessmen, brothers Leonard and Jack Rosen, essentially created Cape Coral by buying a huge swath of land, bulldozing trees and digging one of the world's most extensive canal systems.

Then the people started coming. And they haven't stopped. Today, Cape Coral is the largest city in Southwest Florida in size and population, a community of almost 200,000 people spread over 120 square miles. Where early locals once hunted and fished in a vast expanse of pine trees and palmettos is now a place where people of all ages shop, dine, work, raise families and enjoy retirement.

■ Englewood


Englewood straddles two counties, Charlotte and Sarasota, but it's a singular place.

trict heart on West Dearborn Street. Just east of town, visitors can hike, camp and ride bikes in the Myakka State Forest. On the other side of Englewood is Manasota Key, a beautiful barrier island with restaurants and cottages overlooking the Gulf of Mexico.

■ Estero

Estero used to be little more than a wide spot on U.S. 41 between Fort Myers and Naples, an unincorporated place where folks grew oranges and fished the Estero River.

But since Dec. 31, 2014, it is the Village of Estero, Lee County's newest incorporated community, bustling beyond what anybody might have imagined even very late in the 20th century.

Bits of the past remain at the Koreshan State Historic Site, which preserves 11 buildings that provide a glimpse into the Koreshan Unity, a religious cult that moved here in 1894. The Koreshans are gone now, but a vibrant community where business mixes with pleasure remains.

■ Fort Myers

Fort Myers was incorporated in 1885 with a population of 349 and two years later became the county seat when Lee County was carved out of what was then





Monroe County. Today the downtown area along the Caloosahatchee River is known as the River District, speckled with architectural gems such as the Sidney & Berne Davis Art Center, the Burroughs Home (built in 1901) and the Lee County Courthouse, which was constructed in 1915.

The city's diverse art scene includes Florida Repertory Theatre, the Broadway Palm Dinner Theatre, Barbara B. Mann Performing Arts Hall, Theatre Conspiracy and Laboratory Theater of Florida.

Two Major League Baseball teams, the Boston Red Sox and Minnesota Twins, call Fort Myers their Spring Training home.

■ Fort Myers Beach

Fort Myers Beach on Estero Island was ground zero when Hurricane Ian battered Southwest Florida. Once a 7-mile-long playground of beaches, hotels, restaurants and shops, the kitschy beach community will be rebuilding and under repair/restoration for years to come.

Long before the first Europeans reached the area in the 1500s, the native Calusa resided on the island. Remnants of their time and culture are at the Mound House, an early 20th century cottage built atop one of the mounds the Calusa tucked away from the main road. While the structure survived the storm, the Mound House remained closed to the public weeks after the storm while officials ensured its stability.

■ Immokalee

Immokalee - "my home" in the Seminole language - has a connection to millions of Americans who likely have never even heard of it: About 90% of the nation's winter tomatoes come from farmland here. Cucumbers, bell peppers and citrus also are major crops.

But Immokalee is about more than farming. Seminole Casino Immokalee and its hotel stay abuzz with gaming, food and drink, special shows and concerts.

■ Lehigh Acres

In some ways, Lehigh Acres resembles Cape Coral. Both were created by visionary Northern businessmen in the 1950s and have grown beyond what anybody could have predicted 60 years ago.

But while Cape Coral long ago became an incorporated city, Lehigh Acres remains an unincorporated, 86-squaremile tract of eastern Lee County that about 120,000 people call home.

Known as a community where housing is affordable, its location just east of I-75 puts it within easy driving distance of downtown Fort Myers, Southwest Florida International Airport, Florida Gulf Coast University and the region's beaches and golf courses.

Marco Island

The largest of the Ten Thousand Islands and about a four-hour boat ride from Key West, Marco is the perfect place for all sorts of water sports, from kayaking and standup paddleboarding to fishing and sailing.

Once you cross the SS Jolley Bridge from the mainland, you'll find everything you need for a good time: hotels, restaurants, shops, beaches, golf courses and plenty of ways to get out and enjoy the water, including 6 miles of beaches. Off the sand, there's the Marco Island Historic Museum and the Marco Island Art Center.

■ Pine Island

Along with Fort Myers Beach and San-

ibel-Captiva Islands, this 18-mile-long stretch, Florida's largest island, bore the brunt of Hurricane Ian's devastating force.

Before the storm, Pine Island provided a pleasant glimpse into Florida's past, to a time before high-rise condos and five-star resorts. Its no-frills communities include Bokeelia to the north to St. James City to the south. Before driving onto the island, motorists go through Matlacha ("mat-la-SHAY"). Wiped out by Hurricane Ian but with a temporary road now in place, the once-walkable span connecting Matlacha and Pine Island proudly bore the nickname "The Fishingest Bridge in the World."

■ Port Charlotte

When Forbes magazine in 2015 named the best 25 places to retire in America, Port Charlotte was on the list.

Forbes noted that the cost of living was 8% lower in Port Charlotte than the rest of the country and also cited the unincorporated community for its above-average air quality and low rate of serious crime. It also has great recreation, shopping and culture.

And just a short drive to airports in Punta Gorda, Sarasota and Fort Myers, Port Charlotte isn't just a great place to retire, as Forbes noted. It's a great place to live, period.

Punta Gorda

In Punta Gorda, time is divided between now and B.C., or Before Charley, the powerful hurricane that barreled through the city in 2004.

In the wake of the storm, Punta Gorda essentially reinvented itself.

Nestled along the water where the Peace River meets Charlotte Harbor, the city retains that old-time Florida feel with a historic district near a charming downtown. Although small, Punta Gorda offers much in the way of beauty, art and culture. One of the biggest post-Charley changes was the addition of the Charlotte Harbor & Event Center, a waterfront venue for all sorts of activities a short walk from downtown restaurants, shops and galleries.

■ Sanibel-Captiva

The reopening of the Sanibel Causeway linking these barrier islands to the Lee County mainland within two weeks of Hurricane Ian was an astonishing accomplishment by all measures. It was 1963 when the 3-mile-long span first made the islands accessible by car. Check for updates about public access to the islands.

Residents and visitors alike all look forward to the day when Sanibel and Captiva welcome beachcombers back to do the "Sanibel Stoop" in search of shells, to pedal miles of idyllic bike paths and to hike, bike or drive through the J.N. "Ding" Darling National Wildlife Refuge, where more than 220 species of birds come to roost.






Admission to alliance shows is free, although donations are always welcome.

If you haven't been to Artis in the past year, go see the recently donated Chihuly "Red Reeds," an alfresco installation of 145 6- to 10-foot spikelike blown-glass forms in the Norris Garden.

With a permanent collection of more than 3,500 pieces, many of them representing 20th and 21st century American and Mexican modern movements, plus a 18,000-square-foot expansion in 2020, the Baker is considered the grand dame of Southwest Florida's arts scene.

See: Ongoing exhibitions include six surrealistic paintings by Belgian artist Rene Magritte that haven't been viewed publicly for nearly 50 years, and "Dawn's Forest," a monumental sculpture by pre-eminent American artist Louise Nevelson that is one of the most iconic works in the museum's permanent collection. Through the 2022-23 season also see "Extension and Half Sphere," Jesus Rafael Soto's outdoor sculpture of aluminum and acrylic that dominates the north lawn.

Limited-run exhibits this season include Ran Hwang's "Becoming Again" (through Jan. 8). The largest presentation of the Korean artist's work to

date in the Southeastern United States, it showcases her stunning multimedia installation as well as her iconic silhouettes of Buddhas and plum blossoms. "Love Stories" from the National Portrait Gallery in London (Feb. 4-May 7) presents works by Joshua Reynolds, Angelica Kaufmann, Man Ray, David Hockney and others.

The Baker Museum also celebrates the Sunshine State with "Florida Contemporary 2022-23." The 10th annual exhibition highlights visual artists Edouard Duval-Carrie, Miami; Ya Levy La'ford, Tampa; and Robert Rivers, Maitland (through July 16).

Centers for the Arts Bonita Springs

Do and do some more: With more than 50 different four- and five-week classes and multiple sessions offered each quarter at its two locations, the Centers for the Arts Bonita Springs are the holy grail for aspiring and practiced

This season's curriculum covers just about every medium, including stone-carving, coiled basketmaking, wax-to-bronze casting, metalworking, mosaics, stained glass and even "extreme functional pottery." The center hosts single-night events (supplies included, BYOB) in glass and pottery arts, abstract painting, raku, mosaics and offsite glass-blowing. Its syllabus for teens and children is equally impressive with classes in the fine arts, dance and theater.

Some seasoned instructors are so popular, their classes sell out immediately. New classes are continually introduced, including a figure study of everyday people who pose fully clothed — perfect for those who may be a little bashful when confronted with a nude model (hey, it happens). Classes are taught at the Visual Arts Center and the Performing Arts Center; the latter is the venue for in-demand dance classes. Center members save \$50 on classes.

See: The center's exhibit schedule is also packed with plenty of artistic inspiration sans an admission fee. "Noteworthy" (through Dec. 1) is an open call exhibition that highlights a person, place, thing or thought considered noteworthy. Works by master artist and instructor Mary Parkman are also on display through November. "Black and White" (Dec. 9-Jan. 13) is an open call exhibition of works emphasizing texture, line and composition.

The center also hosts Monday Night Movies at the Moe throughout the season, screening documentaries, classics and art films and encouraging thoughtful discussion afterward.





PICK YOUR SPORT AND FIND YOUR COURT, COURSE, TRACK OR FIELD

Any sport that doesn't require mountains or snow likely is played somewhere in Southwest Florida, a sunsplashed haven for nearly every sporting dream. Well, almost. We've got go-karts and disc golf, traditional golf, mountain biking, tennis and pickleball plus spectator sports such as professional baseball and Division 1 collegiate basketball. There's also bocce ball and shuffleboard, swimming and tennis, softball and volleyball.

Four Major League Baseball teams make their Spring Training homes here: the Boston Red Sox and Minnesota Twins in Lee County, the Tampa Bay Rays in Charlotte County and the Atlanta Braves in North Port, which is in Sarasota County.

Southwest Florida is blessed with a Division 1 collegiate athletic program at Florida Gulf Coast University and also features a top-flight junior college athletic program at Florida SouthWestern State College. Both schools are in Lee County and have on-campus arenas for their basketball and volleyball teams. In Collier County, Ave Maria University has a robust athletic program that includes men's baseball, basketball, football, golf, tennis and women's basketball, soccer, lacrosse, softball, and volleyball.

The region has minor-league sports such as the Fort Myers Mighty Mussels baseball team and the Florida Everblades hockey team.



■ FastTrax Electric Karting & Duckpin Bowling

FastTrax on Summerlin Road south of Fort Myers was closed in the weeks after Hurricane Ian. Check the website for reopening updates..

Until July 2021, it was a defunct place called Zoomers. But new owner Pat Ciniello knows about transforming concepts. He owns HeadPinz and other very 21st century bowling centers under the umbrella corporate name of Bowland.

Mr. Ciniello and the Bowland team know that what worked in a 1950s bowling alley won't work two decades into the 21st century, and they apply that knowledge to FastTrax.

"It's right in our wheelhouse," Mike Cannington, corporate marketing director for Bowland, says about turning the old Zoomers into the FastTrax of today.

The focus here is the Italian-made karts, which come in different sizes and at varying maximum speeds depending on the age of drivers. Duo karts are available so parents can take kids for a spin around the track.




Then there's the bowling.

FastTrax bills its Duckpin bowling as the only such venue in Southwest Florida. In Duckpin, the ball and pins are smaller and competitors get three tries to knock down pins instead of two. FastTrax has seven

Duckpin lanes upstairs.

Stay tuned for more from FastTrax, Mr. Cannington advises. Some vacant land adjacent to FastTrax is owned by Bowland. "There is room for major expansion," he savs.



■ Disc, not disco, golf

This variation of the traditional sport doesn't require as much space or money and the courses aren't as numerous around Southwest Florida. But we do have disc golf courses scattered around the region, from the Bird Bay Executive Course in Venice to courses in Collier County, Estero, North Fort Myers and Port Charlotte.

Fort Myers resident Tim Brown is a professional disc golfer and course designer who has played the game since 1988. He and his colleague Baxter Frost are redesigning and installing an updated disc golf course at North Fort Myers Community Park.

How many of these courses can be found in Southwest Florida?

"There's got to be at least 15," Mr. Brown says.

He expects the list to grow with the possibility of new disc golf courses in Cape Coral, Lemon Bay and Lehigh Acres.

Mr. Brown grew up playing the other form of golf but has over decades been an avid disc golf player. "I like it because it is a lot cheaper than ball golf," he says. Most

And you can play a round of disc golf in about 90 minutes compared with five hours for the other version of golf.

Mr. Brown also points out disc golf is environmentally friendly. "There's no irrigation, no fertilization," he says.

And also fun, with or without disco

■ Pickling away

The sport of pickleball didn't even exist when many of its most fervent players were born. The sport was created in 1965. The cross between badminton, table tennis, and court tennis has boomed beyond what any-









body could likely have imagined half a century ago.

And today in Southwest Florida, pickleball courts are nearly as ubiquitous as chain drug stores.

East Naples Community Park has 64 courts and is the home of the U.S. Open Pickleball Championships.

But the sport is played all over the region, from the 16-court PicklePlex on the Charlotte County campus of Florida SouthWestern State College to courts in thriving new communities such as Babcock Ranch and some that have been converted from tennis courts at the venerable Fort Myers Racquet Club.

Courts can be found down south at the Marco Island Recreation Center and up north at the Venice Community Center and in between at Cape Coral parks.

Mountain biking

They're called the Florida Mudcutters, a band of mountain bikers who participate in their sport a very long way from the nearest mountain. Its 100-plus mem-



bers in Collier, Lee, Hendry, southern Charlotte and southern Glades counties pedal trails from Fort Lauderdale to North Port, Gainesville and Lakeland. Caloosahatchee Regional Park near Alva in east Lee County has 11.5 miles of trails that the Mudcutters website refers to as "single track."

Trails are typically open from mid-October to June or July, depending on the amount of rain that has fallen (most trails are made from clay-based dirt that becomes slippery when wet).

■ Spring Training

MLB training has been a Southwest Florida fixture for nearly a century, dating back to 1924 when the New York Giants started training in Sarasota. In the nine decades since, many teams that have trained here have won the World Series.

The first Southwest Florida World Series winners were the Philadelphia As, who won it all in 1929 and 1930. They trained at Terry Park in Fort Myers from 1925-1936.




